BEAUSOLEIL AVEC MICHAEL DOUCET SATURDAY, JANUARY 12, 8 PM RIALTO THEATRE

A Cajun dance party! America's premier Cajun band, BeauSoleil, will perform on a Saturday night in Tucson for the first time in many years on January 12 at the Rialto Theatre, 318 E. Congress. For 20 years and more than 20 albums, BeauSoleil, led by Michael Doucet, has played both traditional Cajun music and musia which expands Cajun roots.

After 7 nominations, BeauSoleil won the Grammy award for L'Amour Qu La Folie (Love or Folly) in 1997. Starting with Cajun music basics: hot fiddle licks, soulful lyrics in French and irresistible accordion, BeauSoleil adds decades of bayou musical influences including Carribean, New Orleans Jazz, Tin Pan Alley, ballads and a hefty measure of blues. Michael and BeauSoleil began playing traditional songs and music learned from Dennis McGee, Dewey Balfa and others, and they now also add music of their own that fits into the Cajun tradition. Their album Cajunization incorporates various world music into the Cajun sound, and they released a live album in 2001.

A Prairie Home Companion's Garrison Keillor calls BeauSoleil "the best Cajun band in the world." In the song Down at the Twist and Shout, Mary Chapin Carpenter tributes

BeauSoleil, writing. "There ain't no cure for my blues today; except when the paper says BeauSoleil is coming to town."

Round the House is composed of Sharon Goldwasser on fiddle, Dave Firestine on mandolin, 4-string banjo, bouzouki, bodhran and vocals, Mike Smith on guitar, and Claire Jameson Zucker on vocals and bodhran. They've grown from their contra dance roots to develop a real following among fans of traditional Irish music around the state.

Some of the state's best young and adult Irish step dancers (including several of world championship level) will showcase their talents to the band's energetic jigs and reels. Slow airs on fiddle and an assortment of songs, from the silly to the sublime, will fill out the show.

Last year's concert at the Berger sold out, so get your tickets early. Tickets are \$12 in advance (half price for children under 12), and available at Antigone Books, Enchanted Earthworks, and Hear's Music, or charge online at www.dotucson.com/tickets or by phone at 297-9133. RALPH STANLEY & THE CLINCH MOUNTAIN BOYS SATURDAY, JANUARY 12, 3 PM and 8 PM BERGER PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

Bluegrass legend Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mountain Boys bring old time mountain music to Tucson for two shows on Saturday, January 12. One of the most prolific recording artists in any field of music, Ralph Stanley has performed for 55 years and made more than 150 recordings. Known as "The King of Mountain Soul," Ralph Stanley has been a



musical legend for decades. He is now regarded as a superstar since anchoring the soundtrack to the movie "O Brother, Where Art Thou?" The "O Brother" CD has been #1 on the country charts for most of 2001 and won "Album of the Year" from the Country Music Association.

Ralph Stanley is now one of the last direct links to the origins of bluegrass, blues, and country music. As a singer, he has few peers. Stanley has influenced three generations of musicians with his legacy evident in music of George Jones, Dwight Yoakam, Jerry Garcia, and Bob Dylan. On recording with Ralph in 1997, Bob Dylan was ecstatic, declaring the session "the highlight of my career."

HAWAIIAN SLACK KEY GUITAR FESTIVAL THURSDAY, JANUARY 25, 7:30 PM BERGER PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

Three of Hawaii's finest players of Slack Key, "Hawaiian cowboy," guitar, Keola Beamer, George Kahumoku, Jr., and Ozzie Kotani, will perform with dancers on January 25 at the Berger Center. Hawaii in Tucson: this will be a night to remember. Slack key guitar is a style uniquely Hawaiian, developing after the Mexican and Spanish vaqueros introduced the guitar in the 1830's to Hawaiians who had their own deep-rooted musical traditions. The show will combine slack key guitar and songs in Hawaiian with hula (dance) and oli (chant), as well as native percussive stones and sticks and Hawaiian folklore.

From the slopes of Mauna Kea, Hawaii's largest volcano, Keola Beamer comes from a family of performers and composers, dating back to the 15th century when a Beamer was Queen of the island of Hawaii. Keola has played slack key guitar, bamboo nose flute and piano since he was very young. The New York Times calls Keola the "Quintessential master of the slack key guitar style."

Hawai'i's Renaissance man, George Kahumoku Jr., is a master slack key guitar player, songwriter, world-wide performer, high school teacher, former principal, sculptor,

story-teller and a farmer so in tune with his islands that he has won several state and national awards for his work with the land. George began playing music professionally at the age of 13. In his long musical career, George has produced and contributed to many albums. It is no surprise that he received the highest honor in Hawai`i's recording industry, a Na Hoku Hanohano Award.

A respected teacher, arranger, composer and accompanist as well as a solo performer, **Ozzie Kotani** has played slack key guitar, for over 20 years, representing it on the Mainland, in Spain and Japan, as well as all around the Hawaiian islands. He freely interjects his own personality into his playing, preserving and expanding the tradition.

The show will take place at the Berger Performing Arts Center, at 1200 W. Speedway, at the Arizona State Schools for the Deaf and the Blind. All seats are reserved.
