TRADITIONAL AFRICAN DRUMMING



Arizona has a thriving African drumming community, with opportunities for both appreciation and performance in December. In Tucson on Friday, December 5, at 7 PM, El Nido Studio and the Dambe Dance Project present Dances of Passage, a presen-

tation to the community of the work of over 75 students at Tucson High Magnet School working on West African music, dance and recycled visual art techniques. The free performance will be held at the school's theatre at 400 N. 2nd Ave.

The ASU African Drum Ensemble will perform their free Grand Concert on December 7, at the Nelson Fine Arts Center, 10th Street and Mill Ave, Tempe. The repertoire will include traditional sabar music from the Wolof people, music of
