

23rd Annual Tucson Folk Festival

May 3 - 4, 2008

The Tucson Kitchen Musicians' Association (TKMA) presents the family-friendly Tucson Folk Festival, one of the largest free festivals in the United States. Over 100 local, regional and national acts will perform on Saturday and Sunday, May 3 - 4, offering continuous live music featuring folk, blues, Celtic, bluegrass, folk-rock, world, gospel, and Cajun rhythms. Each year, more than 10,000 music fans make their way downtown to enjoy a wide variety of music performed on five stages.

The downtown venues are within easy walking distance from the corner of Church and Alameda. allowing for many musical choices. The Plaza Stage is at El Presidio Park; the Courtyard Stage is on the lawn of the Pima County Courthouse. The Museum Stage is at Tucson Museum of (TMA): the Old Town Artisans (OTA) stage is located in the courtvard of the Old Town Artisans complex at 201 Court Avenue, adjacent to TMA. The New Artists Stage is located next to the Superior Court Building, iust west of Church.

The 2008 Folk Festival kicks off at noon on Saturday, May 3, with a full day of music on four stages, plus workshops, a ballad tree song circle and the annual Songwriters Competition. The day culminates at El Presidio Park with Saturday's headliner, Marley's Ghost on the Plaza Stage at 9:00 p.m.

Sunday's fun begins at 11:00 a.m. with another full day of music on five stages, including an interactive children's show featuring Jonas making music with all kinds of "found objects." The New Artists Stage, located just west of Church and south of the vendor area in El Presidio Park, will also host a full day of music performed by talented young artists under the age of 18. Workshops continue through Sunday in two locations on the festival grounds; the Gospel Singalong takes place early in the day, as does an Instrument Exchange from 11:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. at Old Town Artisans. At 8:00 p.m. the Plaza Stage will be the place to hear the phenomenal Ruthie Foster

TKMA is partnering once again with community radio, KXCI 91.3 FM, which will air the festival on a one-hour tape delay from the Plaza Stage. Popular local on-air celebrities, Carol Anderson and Mike Landwehr, will again co-host the broadcast.

New TKMA President Susan Liechti notes: "The Tucson Folk Festival has a long history of showcasing some of Tucson's talented local musicians as well as outstanding national headliners. It is important to keep a festival like this free to the public so members of our community can be exposed to musical

forms they may not have access to otherwise."

The 2008 Tucson Folk Festival is free and fun for the whole family. A smorgasbord of quality food and craft vendors provide food and drink at both El Presidio Park and the Tucson Museum of Art. The schedule for all events will be available in the program at the festival; visit www.TKMA.org for the latest Tucson Folk Festival updates.

Highlights of this year's Tucson Folk Festival features interactive events for all ages including:

- Pre-Festival Party Kickoff, Friday, May 2, 2008, Old Town Artisans.
- Sunday children's show with Billy Jonas, who will perform an additional set on Sunday that will appeal to an adult/general audience.
- A smorgasbord of quality food and craft vendors at El Presidio and the TMA.
- Sunday's New Artists Stage at El Presidio Park features emerging local artists under the age of 18.
- Songwriting Competition, Saturday, 12:00
 -2:00 p.m. on the Museum Stage.
- Workshops offered on Saturday and Sunday

on the festival grounds in a variety of instrumental, songwriting, and singing techniques. Saturday's Headliner Marley's Ghost will host a workshop on Sunday afternoon.

Sunday, 8:00 - 9:00 p.m. Ruthie Foster will perform on the Plaza Stage. All across North America and Europe. Ruthie Foster is winning thousands of new fans a night, selling a staggering average of 100 CDs per show. Foster mixes contemporary folk with oldschool gospel and blues with dazzling efficiency, showcasing powerhouse voice that draws favorable comparisons to likes of Roberta Flack, Aretha Franklin and Ella Fitzgerald. Billy Jonas will perform a family/adult show 2 PM Courtyard Stage on Saturday and children's show on Sunday (stage and times to announced). Billy Jonas been creating his heartwarming music since 1987. At prestigious festivals and venues nationwide, he has shared the stage with the likes of Ani DiFranco, Richard Thompson, and Pete Seeger. Many of Jonas' original pieces are played on fanciful "industrial re-percussion" instruments made from found objects. Expect to be involved, inspired, enlightened and certainly entertained by the explosion of energy as Billy Jonas seeks to honor the creative energy in everyone - kids and adults alike.

This year, we are lucky to have as one of our two guest callers, Erik Weberg, who is based in Portland, Oregon.

Erik enjoys teaching and calling dances with flowing, interesting figures. He says "Although I enjoy complex figures, complexity does not necessarily translate into pleasure. dancing The dances have to feel good and they have to be fun!"

Whether it's smooth like butter or driving like a freight train, Erik's dances have to make sense as well as having a high fun quotient. He strives to teach efficiently and clearly

with a playful approach and a good sense of community cooperation.

For the past several years, Erik has also been teaching and leading English Country Dance. It's a skill which he surprisingly finds different from calling contra dances and one which he is always looking to improve. He enjoys introducing contra dancers to the beautiful, flowing figures of English dances by weaving them into contra dances. The distinction between contras and ECD becomes blurred at times.

He is also involved in the music side of contra dance life. Erik plays a silver "concert" flute, an Alto flute (which matches the range of a fiddle in standard tuning), harmonicas, and the bombardes (yes, plural) Scottish small pipes. His band Joyride plays for the Portland contradance community.

We look forward to having Erik join us for this year's fabulous Dance in the Desert, which also features Kathy Anderson as our other guest caller.

Kathy joins the Dance in the Desert dance camp for the third time in twelve years. She is one of the most sought-after callers in the country, and has honed her craft since 1982. She has called for dances in the Bahamas, Costa Rica and Europe, as well as in the states from Alaska to Florida

Kathy is known for her energetic and challenging squares, smooth, flowing and exciting contras, clear and concise teaching, and a delightful sense of humor.

She started out playing music on the banjo and piano, and evolved from playing and dancing to calling and to writ-



ing her own dances. Some of her favorites are Carmen's Hat, The Deep Well, The Long Road, Southern Nights, Swing Into Matrimony, and Weave the Line.

She loves to call for contra dances, and she loves to dance! She brings her wireless microphone to the dance hall, and, when she's sure the dancers have a good grip on the figures, she often joins in the lines. It's a sure bet that a lively invigorating time will be had by all during Kathy's dances.
