Songs of protest are very much a part of the folk music tradition. There are themes which are social, political, and precautionary. There are only a handful of these sort of artists who maintain their integrity and continue to write and sing. Pete Seegar and Woody Guthrie come to mind as contemporary activists in song.



Ruthie Gorton is a singer, songwriter, and socio-political activist. sings unaccompanied songs which are original and traditional. She has traveled all over the US, Canada, Mexico, France, Britin, Ireland and Japan. The topics of her songs range from Appalachian miners, women, civil rights and peace to international political change. There are two quotes from Sing Out magazine about Ruthie. One from the August '72 issue by Pete Seegar: "The best new peace songs I've heard this year..." and from a '77 issue: "Ruthie Gorton is a cultural worker in a true sense of the word. She cares deeply and she follows through. She doesn't follow political fad." Let's welcome her on her first trip to Tucson.

For example, the Elizabeth Cotten/Mike Seegar concert cost \$1940. and made \$1950. in gate receipts. Did you know that even the people who worked many hours to bring Lisa and Mike paid full ticket prices to get in?

The upcoming season, 1980-81, calls for six concerts and nine square dances. We've been looking into grants to help us out but we won't count on them until they happen. There will be a general meeting in September to nominate a new board. The elections may be held then or at Tucson Meet Yourself in October. TFTM began at Tucson Meet Yourself in 1975. There won't be another newsletter until September - see you at the square dance in July.
