

On Saturday, November 15, and Sunday, November 16, the Wickenberg Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring its first Bluegrass Festival. The contests will begin at 9 A.M. and the categories include Bluegrass Bands, Old Time Fiddle, Family Bands, Specialty Vocals, Old Time Country Bands, Specialty Instruments and the Arizona Championship Flat-Pick Guitar and Arizona Championship Bluegrass Banjo. The winners of the latter two categories will be eligible to play in the National Competition in Winfield, Kansas. However, it should be a good one this year, and it's time to be able to let you in on some of the things that will probably happen.

The shape of the festival will be the same as in other years. Friday evening, all day Saturday till about 11:00 P.M., and Sunday afternoon are the times, and El Presidio Park is the place, as usual. There will be food booths from almost all our old contributors and perhaps a couple of new groups. The workshop stage (featuring TFTM-er Dan Madden as Genial Host) will be going Saturday and Sunday this year, and we hope to have a few new additions to the usual Liar's



Contest, dance instruction and fiddle styles workshops. Sunday afternoon we hope for a Mexican Children's games workshop, a family song and music workshop (featuring the Jennings Family and Tucson's Ronstadt Family) and maybe even a jam session. Saturday we are trying for an accordion workshop with Czech, Italian and Papago musicians. The regular stage show will go on as before with many of our old pals. The dance groups haven't checked in vet, but I'm pretty sure of Scots and Papagos and Mexican and Norwegians and Hungarians, Clarence Langen will share his fiddling with us, and Joe and Mary Venuti will give us more of their mandola quitar duets. There will be Papago waila music, and Los Chanquitos Feos will be back. We have a few newcomers as well. Tom Schenek's polka quartette will give us the European version of the polka music we have enjoyed from Papago and Norteno groups in the past. A Chinese Lion Dance team from Agustin Fong's Wing Chun Gung Fu Federation will

cont. from last page perform Saturday night, as will the Harper Brothers -- a mountain brother duet which got its start on WLVA in Lynchburg, Virginia in 1946. They play mandolin and quitar, and Rocky Harper will also share his old time comedy act with us. He spent five years as Charlie Monroe's clown, and reminds me of Les Keith's Cuzzin Winesap act. We are also negotiating with a real delta bluesman who lives in town, and hope to get him on the show as well. So you can see that things will be as varied and exciting as ever in the music line.



Our real innovations will be in the crafts area this year. Saturday afternoon, a Mormon quilting frame...with a couple of extra chairs so that folks can sit in, learn a bit, and listen to the ladies talk about their traditions. There will also be a demonstration area with Japanese origami, Mexican ribbon flower making, and other Mexican paper crafts. We are even hoping for a Japanese Tea Ceremony, but that's still up in the air. there will be a couple of other surprises that we aren't ready to talk about yet.

So it's going to be some festival this year. Put the weekend aside and come on down...and oh, yes! TFTM traditionally does the Information Booth, so you will even get a chance to help out in what we feel is Tucson's cultural event of the year. (And if you want to do something else, we can help you there, too.) So we'll see you there!
