A special series of out-of-state callers will be making the circuit of Arizona dance communities. TFTM is collaborating with the Phoenix Friends of Old Time Music, dancers in Prescott, and the Flagstaff Friends of Traditional Music to bring callers from the West Coast, Midwest, and East to tour the state.

Eric Black will be starting off the series by calling in Prescott on Friday, November 5, and in Tucson on Saturday, November 6 at our regular first Saturday dance. Eric is a long time Bay area caller and dance organizer. He has called all over the U.S. and in Denmark and led the 1992 Dance Friendship Tour to Russia and the Ukraine. Eric will be calling contra's and squares and promises something for everyone. He will also run a caller's workshop on Saturday, location TBA. Call 327-1779 for info.

Coming later in the season will be Kathy Anderson, an energetic caller from Dayton, Ohio, to call in Flagstaff, Phoenix and Tucson in February. Bob Dalsemer, long time caller from North Carolina, will return in March to call in all four communities. Kathy and Bob will also present special workshops, in addition to calling dances.

The series promises to keep Arizona dancing lively and full of variety. There will be lots of opportunities for learning something new for dancers and callers. CATHIE WHITESIDES & HANK BRADLEY SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 27th

TFTM welcomes Cathie Whitesides and Hank Bradley from Seattle for this post-Thanksgiving contra dance and potluck!

On Saturday, November 27th, bring your leftover food and be ready for a dance that will burn off a few calories. The dance will be at New Doors for the Arts, which has a great rough-wood floor (wear smooth soled shoes, not tennies). Come early, 6:00 pm, for a potluck and then dance starting at 7:30pm. After a set of dancing, CATHIE AND HANK will treat us with a concert at the break. Both are great fiddlers, and they also play banjo, guitars, and Greek bouzouki. CATHIE is one of the country's great dance fiddlers, and also toured the Soviet Union on a dance tour, and plays Cape Breton, Slavic, and Rumanian tunes as well as American. HANK is a past

fiddle champion, bouzouki, and guitar player, who also sings traditional songs in a unique, often humorous style. Hank's two albums include *Music of the Poison Coyote Kid* (his nickname) and *Hassle the Caller*. Hank has over 20 years performance experience, including at the first Port Townsend Fiddle Tunes Festivals 15 years ago.

"From contradanza to chachachá ·A Caribbean continuum" is the title of a lecture/ demonstration to be presented at the U. of A. school of music on Friday Nov. 12 at 8 pm. Ted Solís, is an ethnomusicologist from ASU, will trace the development of the dance from the Cuban (Spanish) contradanza (much like contra dancing) as it evolves and becomes increasingly Africanized and Caribbeanized. ultimately becoming mambo and chachachá.
