# **BECKY REPORTS ON CALLER'S CAMP**

I'd like to thank the dancers who bought goodies at the bake sales from March to June, and those who generously made additional contributions. By indulging your sweet teeth (and sweet hearts) you helped me attend Dance Caller's Week at the John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, North Carolina during the third week of June. The sales produced a check for \$200 that went toward my travel expenses.

Brasstown is in the southwest corner of North Carolina, south of the Smoky Mountains. To save travel and housing expenses, I recruited my parents for the trip. Mom signed up for the basic woodcarving class, and Dad brought his computer to work on. We rendezvoused in New Jersey midweek, and, with trailer in tow, we drove two days south and west. Sunday evening after supper our week-long classes began. Five of us came for the caller's class, three men and three women, from Tucson, Santa Barbara, Sonora (CA), Seattle, and Long Island. All but one had been calling for a year or more. The group was filled out with two more men auditing the class: one had kids attending the Little/Middle Folk School programs, and one was a work/study intern at the school. After introductions, we got right to work.

It was the start of a busy week. We had six hours of class time every day, then a dance from 7:00 to 10:00 every night. Bob Dalsemer, our instructor, called all of the Monday night dance, but after that, we students took most of each evening's program. This meant that all so-*Contined on back of dance card*

called free time in the week, sometimes including after the dance, we were madly practicing our new projects. I worked on braving New England style squares, and learned two.

During our class time we worked with Bob (who called here this March and in previous years), and Steve Hickman and John Devine, two marvelous musicians. We discussed music types and styles, program planning (a practicum every day!), operating a sound system (more practice every night), and dance history. We watched video tapes of dancing in different parts of the country, and footage of dancing at the Folk School in the 1930's. We practiced call timing and phrasing, teaching techniques, and calling squares, and working with kids (three "hands-on" sessions). Since we had a relatively experienced group. Friday afternoon we swapped dances.

It was an exhausting and wonderful week, but my trip wasn't over. I also danced in New Jersey, and worked on taping my parents' collection of 78 rpm square dance records from the 1940's. Being with my parents at this time was a special treat, as they reminisced about dancing in New Jersey and New York State in the '30's and '40's. I also got to dance with them and observe their vintage dance style, unchanged because they haven't danced much since that time.

So, thank you again for helping to make this trip happen. I feel I learned a lot, and I hope that you find it makes dancing more fun when I'm behind the mike. — Becky Nankivell


MONDAY NIGHTS, 4th Avenue Social Club (424 N. 4th), 8-10 pm. This is a low key really fun dance on a wooden floor!

### FEEDBACK, INPUT, MAILING LIST: MAKE A DANCE CONNECTION

A new feature of the already crowded table you pass as you enter or leave the dance is a purple box labeled, "TFTM DANCE CONNECTION." Use the violet strips of paper to let the dance organizers and callers know what you think about the evening's dance or our dances in general. What do you enjoy? Are there things you don't like? What ideas do you have for the dances? Put your thoughts in the Dance Connection box.

The other main purpose of the Dance Connection box is to generate a mailing list of all the dancers, including members and non-members of TFTM. With this mailing list we can send you news of interest specifically to you as a dancer. Get your name on the list!

If you really want to have an effect on how the dances go, be a dance producer! (See article below).

## DANCE PARTICIPATION

If you love contra dancing, you may be thinking about getting more involved. In Tucson, this is not hard to do. The dance can always use your help!

Jump in: help with set up, clean up, or be an experienced body in the beginner's session before the dance.

- Usually the band is open to any musicians (but check with the producer in case a special set band is scheduled).
- Dance production (coordinating an evening of dance including scheduling callers) is open to regular dancers who are TFTM members. Contact me, or come to a dance committee meeting (announced in the newsletter).
- Callers: if you are ready to call, phone me to get on the list. Contact me if you are interested in learning to call, as well. Monday night dances are an excellent place to try your stuff with a smaller, more forgiving crowd.
- The **TFIM** dance committee has open membership-just attend the occasional meetings to help plan and improve TFIM dances. The next dance committee meeting is Saturday, August 20th, before the dance at Armory Park, 6:30 pm, with pizza.
