BILL & LIBBY HICKS

OLD-TIME, BLUES, AND ORIGINAL SONGS & TUNES

SUNDAY, APRIL 6, 7 PM

SONORA COHOUSING

TFTM is proud to present Bill and Libby Hicks at our contra dance on Saturday, April 5 (with caller Becky Nankivell) and in a Common House concert on Sunday, April 6. Bill and Libby have been mainstays of the North Carolina traditional music scene since the 1970s.

Performing together since 1982, They have had plenty of time to merge minds and styles and have developed a simpatico duet style on fiddle, guitar and keyboard that often makes people check to see if it really is only two people playing.

Sing Out! magazine said this about their 2001 cd, *South of Nowhere*: "Bill's fiddle style begins with well-known Jarrell and Hammons influences, but he has

incorporated elements from artists as diverse as Kenny Baker, Stephan Grappelli, Miles Davis, and Charlie Parker. He is ably accompanied by Libby's powerful guitar playing, which has acquired a quirky, rhythmically exciting character derived from both classic fingerstyle blues techniques and hot-licks flatpicking. There is something for everyone to enjoy on this release."

And of their singing *Dirty Linen* said, "Bill and Libby's voices work well together, with Bill's strong and almost conversational lead tied together by Libby's clear, high harmony. Libby's background is in the Piedmont blues, and her talents in this field shine on several great tracks...."

Bill was a founding member of



the Red Clay Ramblers. He made a name for himself all over the map with his energetic fiddling, developed over years of seeking out and learning literally at the feet of the old masters such as Tommy Jarrell and Burl

At the annual general meeting on Saturday, March 1, the following members were elected to the Board of Directors of Tucson Friends of Traditional Music: **Marilyn Cleavinger, Karen Collins, Becky Nankivell, Sally Rein'l, Steve Richard, and Dale Tersey.** Officers will be elected at the April 21 meeting of the Board.

Many, many thanks for their hard work are due to outgoing board members **Tina Dodd, Steve Moore, and Craig Tinney** (reverting to emeritus status).

At the March 10 meeting of the Board, a timeline of three months (to June 30) was set for dissolving the position of the Managing Director and dispersing the duties among the officers, directors, and volunteers of the organization. **Becky Nankivell** will retire from the position to pursue other work in the world of traditional music and dance education.

Hammons. In 1995, the Merle Watson Festival sponsored a reunion of his first band, the Fuzzy Mountain String Band, to celebrate the reissue on CD by Rounder Records of their early '70s recordings of fiddle tunes, still recognized as the "gold standard" of string band music.

Libby was the harmonizing half of a duet with Lightnin' Wells for seven years. They specialized in the old-time "brother duet" style of singing, with Libby playing guitar and singing Charlie, Earl, Ira, or Alton's parts usually, depending on which pair of brothers they were "borrowing from" – or rather "paying tribute to" – at the time.

The concert will start at 7 pm at the Common House of Sonora Cohousing, 501 E. Roger Rd. (just west of First Ave.), with a suggested donation of \$10-\$12, or \$5 for students. The Common House provides a venue with the opportunity for the performers and audience to interact very directly, but with more leg-room than your average living room.

old house on Fremont street. And when the lesson was over, the students were joined by musicians of every ilk who brought their instruments, friends and a dish to share. A whole lot of music and a sense of community was also shared there. And when someone had a hard time, an illness or accident, Kathy would say, "This is a job for the kitchen musicians! Lets throw a benefit."

When word got out that a benefit for Kathy was in the making, the performer schedule filled up in a twinkling, and the concert became an all-day fest.

Kathy, who had childhood polio, is preparing for surgeries to her shoulders, to repair the damage done to ligaments, torn from a life time of walking with crutches. The recovery time is 16 weeks, with the arms immobilized. It would be a difficult enough time for someone with the use of their legs, but for Kathy, this will be a period of almost total immobility, when she cannot take care of daily things, drive to work, etc. .

Scheduled to appear are the **Titan Valley Warheads, The Mollys, Ted Ramirez & the Santa Cruz River Band, Ken Tucker & James Swafford, Linda Lou & the Drifters, Sal Valdivia, Black Leather Zydeco, Bill Lackey with Bob Hauth & James Swafford, and Kathy Rote**, an award winner songwriter and fine picker. Special guest **Travis Edmonson**, will host and sing with daughters **Ellen Murphy & Erin Kissel**. There are two surprise players still working on their travel plans.

The Valley of the Moon is a lovely old property located at 2544 E. Allen (one long block north of Prince Rd. and one block east of Tucson Blvd.) Seating is on the lawn, so bring your picnic blanket or folding chair, and your dancing shoes. 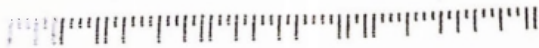
